What is the offer?

Take your KS1 or KS2 class on a hands-on learning adventure celebrating the legacy of Sir John Vanbrugh.

- Each school will explore their local Vanbrugh site through a guided visit packed with fun, interactive educational activities – all designed to spark curiosity and creativity.
- Before and after your visit, your pupils can dive deeper with ready-to-use classroom resources that link directly to the trip – inspiring pupils to design, imagine, and create just like Vanbrugh himself. Every activity has been carefully designed to support key learning objectives across multiple curriculum areas, including Literacy, Art, Design, D&T, History, Science, and STEM at KS1 and KS2. Resources include a comprehensive Teachers’ Pack to guide you through the project.

All downloadable resources are freely available on the Vanbrugh 300 website, so every school can get involved – whether or not a site visit is possible.


