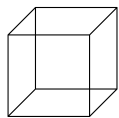

Cube



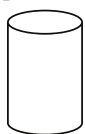
Can you find a cube?

Cuboid



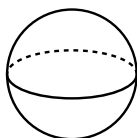
Can you find a cuboid?

Cylinder



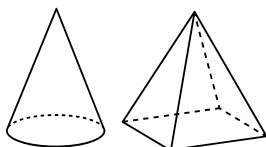
Can you find a cylinder?

Sphere



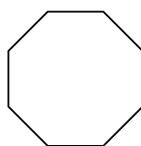
Can you find a sphere?

Can you find a cone or a pyramid?
(Clue: roofs, spires, towers or other pointed features.)

Octagon



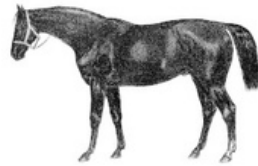
Can you find an octagon?
(Clue: this shape is used in more places than you would expect at Castle Howard)
